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In the past year, the Mark Morris Institute (MMI) continued its unwavering commitment to providing the highest quality nutrition education for veterinary students. We served over 2,500 students – solidifying our position as the leading independent organization dedicated to this critical field.

MMI contributes to veterinary education by filling in gaps for schools and programs with no veterinary nutritionist on faculty and by providing valuable resources to schools who may otherwise be unable to access them.

In 2023, we strategically invested in our College Teaching Program by:

- Surveying participating veterinary colleges and universities on their current and future curriculum needs.
- Curating the most up-to-date nutrition research and data for our curriculum with our instructional designer.
- Maintaining a team of highly qualified faculty, including seven ACVIM board-certified veterinary nutritionists.

We remain dedicated to providing unbiased, evidence-based education to veterinary students and professionals. As the demand for this knowledge grows, we are developing new online learning modules and software to increase our reach in a sustainable and scalable way.

MMI was founded by Hill's Pet Nutrition to advance small animal nutrition and build upon the inspiring work of Drs. Mark Morris Sr. and Jr.



Our team of ACVIM board-certified veterinary nutritionists work diligently to curate the most up-to-date, objective research and data on small animal nutrition






Dr. Mark L. Morris, Jr. (1934-2007)

FINANCIAL **OVERVIEW**

OUR VALUES BY THE NUMBERS

The majority of our funds (80%) support the College Teaching Program and essential day-to-day administration. The remaining expenses are directed towards specific initiatives such as the MMI Nutrition Guide development (12%), legal and accounting fees (7%), and board communications (1%).



2023 IMPACT

BRIDGING THE GAP IN VETERINARY NUTRITION EDUCATION

Despite the importance of nutrition to animal health, many AVMA-accredited veterinary schools do not have a small animal nutrition service or a full-time, board certified veterinary nutritionist.

MMI helps bridge this gap by providing expert faculty and high-quality teaching materials so that all veterinary schools can provide evidenced-based education to their students

This year, our College Teaching Program continued to provide access to vital veterinary nutrition education. We partnered with 19 veterinary schools in the US, 4 in Canada, 2 in the Caribbean, and 1 in Mexico to provide nutrition instruction.

Our faculty, including **7 ACVIM board-certified veterinary nutritionists**, delivered **433 hours** of instruction to **2,505 veterinary students** across both spring and fall semesters.

This enhanced training better equips future veterinarians with the knowledge and skills to provide optimal nutritional guidance for their future animal patients.

MMI fosters impactful collaborations with leading veterinary nutritionists, educators, and institutions to build a strong foundation for the future of animal health, together.

MMI Nutrition Guide

We are pleased to report significant progress on the MMI Nutrition Guide, a first-of-its-kind online software designed to support classroom instruction and veterinarians in practice. This innovative tool will provide concise summaries of nutritional modifications for common conditions and disease presentations in dogs and cats.

The MMI Nutrition Guide will also allow users to compare nutrient concentrations between commercial therapeutic pet foods from different manufacturers.





Clinical Curriculum Development

MMI staff, faculty, and consultants spent 2023 enhancing and expanding our course catalog, bringing in experts in their respective fields to contribute to new learning materials especially for 3rd and 4th year veterinary students.
